The High Tower Challenge is now in its 30th year having started in 1993. The event has built a good following over the past 30 years with many shooters, including most of the country's top shots, testing their skill on the extreme targets presented, with some making it on the winner's board as a result.

We would like to thank this year's sponsors Hull Cartridge Company without which we wouldn't have 3000 of their superb cartridges to give to the winners.

This year's challenge started in the Bunker with two left to right targets which were not soft and could lead to some being dropped. We then moved into the Quarry and slowly built up in complexity until the last stand in the skeet, the skeet layout presented a left to right Battue from a small tower, a floating left to right from the 110ft tower, a long distance 90mm crow, a big right to left Battue from the 120ft tower and a looper.

The battue from the 120ft tower proved to be the one to hit and ruined a few cards also, as did the last stand!

There was a large array of target presentation from all three fixed towers and six mobile towers, standard, battue and 90mm clays were thrown.

The course was set for 43, but during the event some really big scores came in but then Mark Bowes came and shot an awesome 47 which gave him the High Tower Challenge crown for 2023 for the second year running, fantastic shooting and a score we certainly didn't see out there, well done Mark.

We had some good battles in the other classes with leads changing regularly.
